

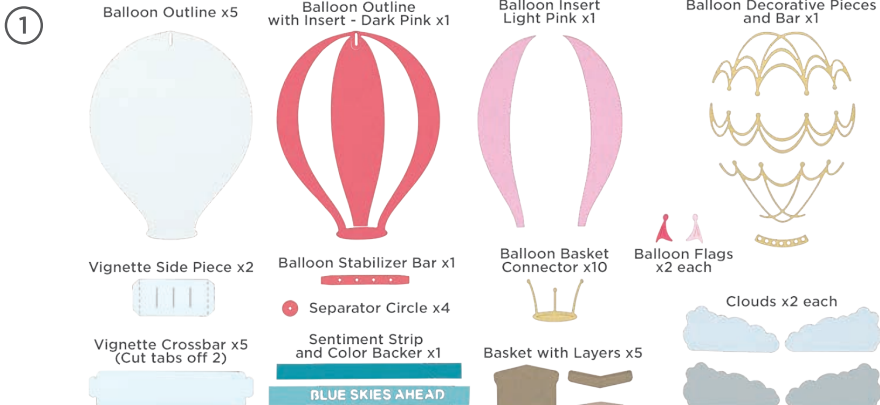
## 3D Vignette Hot Air Balloon

S6-200

### Supplies:

- Platinum™ or Platinum 6™ Machine
- Cardstock in 2 shades of Pink, White, Kraft, 2 shades of Teal, Light Gray
- Bearly Art Glue PCG02E
- Adhesive Foam
- Basic Crafting Tools

Approximate Finished Size:  
1.30 x 3.10 x 5.80 in | 3.5 x 7.9 x 14.8 cm



Cut pieces as shown. Cut tabs off 2 of the Vignette crossbars; those will be for the front and back layers.



Attach 3 inner layers into the slots of the Vignette side pieces.  
Adhere back crossbar (tabs cut off) to the folded tabs of the Vignette side pieces. Decorate front crossbar as shown with clouds and sentiment. Use foam adhesive for sentiment strip to add dimension. Adhere to front tabs of Vignette side pieces, making sure it is level with the back piece.

Place initial layers (light and dark pink stripes) onto white base first.  
Bend tabs on stabilizer bar at scorelines and thread through front balloon and glue down. Then continue decorating the balloon (this is important to do after you've added the bar because the decorative piece covers the tab).  
For the balloon/basket connector, glue 2 together (x5) to add more stability and strength. Let dry.  
Adhere connectors to balloons.  
Adhere decorative layers to baskets and let dry.  
Glue baskets to the balloon/basket connectors.

Run stabilizer bar through remaining balloons. Option: Turn back balloon so the front of the basket is facing out. Glue tab of stabilizer bar to back layer.  
Turn pieces to the side and line up separator circles to the holes on the stabilizer bar, gluing in place (tweezers work best for this). This will help stabilize the top and still be able to fold flat for mailing (padded envelope recommended).

Adhere the front balloon to the back of the decorated crossbar with adhesive of choice, centered. Let dry completely.  
Repeat with the next 3 layers, making sure that each layer is lined up with the first and dry (if using wet adhesive) before adhering next layer.  
For the last layer, glue to the outside of the crossbar (add more clouds if you like so it's in the clouds!).
